General Rules

- L 100 Subject to the peremptory provisions of the Nursing Act, Act 50 of 1978, and subject to the minimum requirements set by the South African Nursing Council regarding the above-mentioned degrees and diplomas, the Senate may permit deviations from the following rules on good grounds, with or without conditions.
- L 101 In terms of the provisions of the Nursing Act, Act 50 of 1978, any candidate enrolling for a course in Nursing Science must submit proof of current registration as a nurse with the South African Nursing Council as well as proof of current membership of the South African Nursing Association. Proof of current registration and membership must accompany the application for admission and must be submitted each year with the University registration form.
- L 102 Unless otherwise stated, the original certificate of registration as a general nurse, midwife, etc., with the South African Nursing Council, must accompany the application for admission.
- L 103 Candidates for the B.Cur., B.Cur. (I. et A.) and B.Cur. Hons degrees and the above-mentioned diplomas, shall be selected on merit before the first half of November of the year preceding the first year of study. The head of the Department of Nursing Science may, if deemed necessary, request a candidate to submit proof of proficiency in English and Afrikaans.

Rules for the degree of Baccalaureus Curationis

Note: A candidate who holds this degree qualifies for registration as a Nurse (General, Psychiatric, Community) and as a Midwife with the South African Nursing Council.

- L 104 Admission
A candidate shall be admitted to the studies for this degree, only if the candidate:
104.1 complies with the matriculation requirements for degree studies as set out in the Calendar under the heading *Admission to the University*;
104.2 is registered as a student nurse with the South African Nursing Council;
104.3 submits proof of holding a post as a student nurse at a training hospital approved by the South African Nursing Council.
- L 105 Duration of Study
The curriculum shall extend over a period of at least four academic years.
- L 106 Practical and clinical training
A candidate shall complete a prescribed clinical practical programme at an approved training hospital and in approved community services.
- L 107 Obtaining the degree
The degree shall be obtained by completing the courses and practical work prescribed in rules L 106 and L 110.
- L 108 Awarding of the degree *cum laude*
The degree shall be awarded *cum laude* if a candidate complies with the requirements of rules G 107.1 and G 107.2 provided that
108.1 for the purposes of rule G 107.1.2 only General Nursing Science, Community Nursing Science, Psychiatric Nursing Science and Midwifery shall be regarded as major subjects;
108.2 the average mark obtained for the practical examination in Nursing Science shall be at least 75;
108.3 a mark of at least 60 has been obtained for all other courses prescribed for the degree;
108.4 the provisions of rule G 107.1.4 shall apply only to courses prescribed for the degree.
- L 109 Promotion to a following year of study
109.1 A candidate must pass the following courses in the first year of study before admission to the second year of study:
Fundamental Nursing Science 1
Anatomy 1
Community Nursing Science 1
109.2 A candidate shall be admitted to the third year of study only after passing all the courses prescribed for the first year of study as well as the following courses prescribed for the second year of study:
General Nursing Science 2
Physiology 1
Community Nursing Science 2
Psychiatric Nursing Science 1
Midwifery 2

*It is recommended that Mathematics and/or Biology and/or Physical Science be taken as a matriculation subject.

*Such registration will be undertaken by the Department of Nursing Science on behalf of the student after enrolment.

RULES FOR THE DEGREES AND DIPLOMAS IN NURSING SCIENCE

General Rules

- H 135 Subject to the minimum requirements set by the South African Nursing Council regarding the above-mentioned degrees and diplomas, the Senate may permit deviations from the following rules on good grounds, with or without conditions.
- II 136 In terms of the provisions of the Nursing Act, Act 50 of 1978, candidates enrolling for a course in Nursing Science must submit proof of current registration as a nurse with the South African Nursing Council. Proof of personal professional indemnity insurance is required for the purpose of indemnity cover. Proof of current registration and membership must accompany the application for admission and must be submitted each year with the University registration form.
- II 137 Unless otherwise stated, a certified copy of the certificate(s) of registration as a general nurse, midwife, etc., with the South African Nursing Council, must accompany the application for admission.
- II 138 Subject to section 10(4) of the Universities Act, Act 61 of 1955, candidates for the BCur and BCur (I et A) degrees and the above-mentioned diplomas, shall be selected on merit. The Head of the Department of Nursing Science may, if deemed necessary, request candidates to submit proof of proficiency in English and Afrikaans.
- II 139 Where Nursing Science courses have a written and a practical examination, candidates must pass both the written and the practical examinations in order to gain credit for the course.

Rules for the degree of Baccalaureus Curationis

Note: Candidates who hold this degree qualify for registration as nurses and as midwives with the South African Nursing Council.

- II 145 Admission
Prospective students shall be admitted to the studies for this degree, only if they:
145.1 comply with the matriculation requirements for degree studies as set out in the Calendar under the heading *Admission to the University*;
145.2 are registered as student nurses with the South African Nursing Council;
145.3 submit proof of holding a post as a student nurse at a health authority approved by the South African Nursing Council. Should there be a shortage of training positions available, they may by special arrangement be placed in a temporary training position.
- II 146 Duration of Study
The curriculum shall extend over a period of at least four academic years. Upon admission full-time candidates may be required to extend their studies over a period of at least five years.
- II 147 Practical and clinical training
Candidates shall complete a prescribed clinical practical programme at an approved hospital and in approved community services.
- II 148 Obtaining the degree
The degree shall be obtained by completing the courses and practical work prescribed in rules II 146 and II 150.
- II 149 Awarding of the degree *cum laude*
The degree shall be awarded *cum laude* if candidates comply with the requirements of rules G 107.1 and G 107.2 provided that
149.1 for the purposes of rule G 107.1.2 only Nursing Science and Primary Health Care shall be regarded as major subjects;
149.2 the provisions of rule G 107.1.4 shall apply only to courses prescribed for the degree.

*It is recommended that Mathematics and/or Biology and/or Physical Science be taken as a matriculation subject.

*Such registration will be undertaken by the Department of Nursing Science on behalf of students after enrolment.

111 Admission

A candidate shall be admitted to the studies for this degree only if the candidate

111.1 complies with the matriculation requirements for degree studies as set out in the Calendar under the heading *Admission to the University*;

111.2 is registered with the South African Nursing Council as a general nurse and in the case of a female candidate who wishes to enrol for the courses in Community Nursing Science with a view to recognition by the South African Nursing Council as a community nurse, is registered as a midwife with the South African Nursing Council or, in the case of a male candidate, as a general nurse;

111.3 has had at least two years' experience in clinical nursing in a full-time post after such registration, if the candidate registers for this degree while on full-time study leave.

112 Admission to studies in Nursing Science 4

 - (iii) B.Cur.Hons (Advanced Psychiatric Nursing Science): in advanced psychiatric nursing science;

119 General
Except as otherwise provided for below, the degree shall be awarded in accordance with the General Rules for Honours Degrees.

120 Admission
120.1 Subject to the specific admission requirements for the different fields of advanced study as set out in rule 121, a candidate shall be admitted to the studies for the degree if she/he holds a Baccalaureus Curationis or an equivalent degree.

120.2 In the case of the non-clinical fields of study, another approved bachelor's degree may be considered for the purposes of admission.

120.3 An applicant shall not be admitted as a candidate for the degree except with the approval of the Executive Committee of the Board of the Faculty of Arts, on the recommendation of the Head of the Department of Nursing Science.

121 Specific admission requirements for different fields of study

121.1 Clinical fields of study
A candidate must hold an approved post and have had at least one year of appropriate experience.

121.1.1 Advanced General Nursing Science:
Registration with the South African Nursing Council as a general nurse and in intensive nursing science, is required.

121.1.2 Advanced Midwifery and Neonatal Nursing Science:
Registration with the South African Nursing Council as a general nurse and as a midwife, is required.

121.1.3 Advanced Psychiatric Nursing Science:
Registration with the South African Nursing Council as a general and psychiatric nurse, is required.

121.2 Non-clinical fields of study:
A candidate must hold an approved post.

121.2.1 Nursing Education:
Registration with the South African Nursing Council as a general nurse and either as a midwife or psychiatric nurse and as a tutor, is required.

121.2.2 Nursing Administration:
Registration with the South African Nursing Council as a general nurse and either as a midwife or psychiatric nurse and registration in nursing administration, is required.

121.2.3 Community Nursing Science:
Registration with the South African Nursing Council as a general and community nurse, is required.

L 122 Duration of study
The curriculum shall extend over a period of at least one academic year.

L 123 Obtaining the degree
The degree shall be obtained by completing the prescribed courses and practical work where applicable.

L 124 Examination
The examination may take the form of an oral or written examination.

L 125 Awarding of the degree cum laude
The degree shall be awarded *cum laude* if a candidate complies with the following requirements:

- 125.1** The curriculum for the degree must have been completed in one academic year.
- 125.2** None of the courses prescribed for the degree may have been failed.

II 165 General

Except as otherwise provided for below, the degree shall be awarded in accordance with the General Rules for Honours Degrees.

II 166 Admission

166.1 Subject to the specific admission requirements for the different fields of advanced study as set out in rule 11 167, candidates shall be admitted to the studies for the degree if they hold a Baccalaureus Curationis or an equivalent degree.

166.2 Prospective students shall be admitted to the studies for the degree only if a pass mark of at least 60 is obtained in the major subjects of the Baccalaureus degree. Candidates may be required to supplement their knowledge of a particular topic to the satisfaction of the Head of the Department.

166.3 Candidates must occupy an approved post or possess appropriate experience.

166.4 Applicants shall not be admitted as candidates for the degree except with the approval of the Executive Committee of the School of Health Sciences, on the recommendation of the Head of the Department of Nursing Science.

166.5 Candidates must hold a professional qualification in the field of study in which research is being done for the treatise.

II 167 Specific admission requirements for different fields of study as follows:

167.1 Advanced Midwifery and Neonatal Nursing Science:

Unless the Senate decides otherwise, candidates must be registered with the South African Nursing Council as general nurses and as midwives.

167.2 Advanced Psychiatric Nursing Science:

Unless the Senate decides otherwise, candidates must be registered with the South African Nursing Council as general nurses and must hold a recognised basic qualification in psychiatric nursing.

167.3 Advanced General Nursing Science:

Unless the Senate decides otherwise, candidates must be registered with the South African Nursing Council as general nurses.

167.4 Advanced Primary Health Care:

Unless the Senate decides otherwise, candidates must be registered with the South African Nursing Council as community nurses.

167.5 Advanced Professional Nursing Science:

Unless the Senate decides otherwise, candidates must be registered with the South African Nursing Council in Nursing Administration and Nursing Education.

II 168 Duration of study

The curriculum shall extend over a period of at least one academic year of full-time study or two academic years of part-time study.

II 169 Obtaining the degree

The degree shall be obtained by completing the prescribed courses and practical work where applicable.

II 170 Examination

170.1 The examination may take the form of an oral or written or a written and practical examination.

170.2 A pass mark of at least 50 is required for the treatise as well as for the prescribed courses.

II 171 Awarding of the degree cum laude

The general rules for Honours degrees shall apply.

KURSUSSE IN VERPLEEGKUNDE, APRIL 19731. OPDRAG VAN DIE KOMITEE VAN ALGEMENE SAKKE

- (1) Dat die saak verwys word na 'n komitee bestaande uit prof. T. Erasmus (sameroeper) en dr. P.J. Maree, vir ondersoek en rapportering aan die Komitee vir Algemene Sake met die oog op 'n aanbeveling aan die Senaat en die Raad;
- (2) dat die volgende as basis vir ondersoek kan dien:
 - 2.1 Waar so 'n kursus struktureel kan inpas;
 - 2.2 die akademiese peil van die kursusse;
 - 2.3 die hele curriculum;
 - 2.4 finansiële implikasies;
 - 2.5 samestelling van adviserende korps (intern en ekstern);
 - 2.6 ander fasiliteite wat benodig mag word;
 - 2.7 aanverwante aangeleenthede (vergadering 26/2/73).

2. VERSLAG

Die komitee het 'n paar keer vergader asook samesprekings gevoer met Prof. C. Searle - professor in Verpleegkunde, U.P., Mej. Russel Jones - inspektoriese verpleegstersopleiding, K.P.A., mev. Stander - matrone Provinsiale Hospitaal en mev. Smith - hoof van die Sharley Cribb Verplegingskollege, P.E.

Hieruit het dit duidelik geblyk dat daar wel 'n behoefte bestaan vir die opleiding van verpleegstersdosente asook vir die opleiding van gegraduateerde verpleegsters. Daar was trouens die gevoel dat U.P.E. 'n plig het om hierdie diens in die Oos-Kaap te lewer.

Ofskoon die opdrag van die Komitee van Algemene Sake (verw. 15.6.4.11 van 9 Maart) slegs op die Diploma in Verplegingsonderwys betrekking het, het die komitee dit goed gedink om ook op die moontlikheid van 'n graadkursus in Verpleegkunde te ondersoek. Ons motiveer dit as volg:

1. Volgens S/51/73 het dr. R.L.M. Kotze, Direkteur van Hospitaaldienste vir Kaapland, onder item 2.2 versoek dat 'n graadkursus ook aangebied word.
2. Prof. C. Searle het ons daarop gewys dat meer as 60% van die kursusse wat vir die Diploma in Verpleegstersdosente benodig word, ook deur die graadkursus gebruik word.
3. Volgens skatting sal daar slegs ongeveer 5 studente per jaar vir die Diploma inskryf en die komitee is van mening dat sulke lae studentegetalle nie die instel van die spesiale kursusse regverdig nie. Indien die kursusse egter ook deur ander rigtings soos bv. die graadkursus benut kan word, kan dit geregtig word.
4. Die behoefte aan 'n graadkursus is blykbaar groter as vir die Diploma vir dosente indien getalle by U.P. as 'n maatstaf geneem kan word. Van die 217 ingeskrewe studente in die Departement Verpleegkunde by U.P. is daar 150 graadstudente en 26 Diploma-vir-dosente-studente. Deur die twee kursusse dus aan te bied, word tot 'n groot mate aan die behoeftes voldoen.

AANBEVELINGS

Die voorgaande volg dit dat die komitee voel dat die aanbieding van 'n Diploma Verplegingsdosente slegs sinvol sal wees indien dit tesame met 'n graadkursus Verpleegkunde gesien word en aanbeveling 1 volg uit hierdie beskouing.

Aanbeveling 1: Dat die instelling van 'n Diploma vir Verplegingsdosente slegs word indien dit onmiddellik of 'n jaar na die eerste aanbieding ingeskakel word by 'n graadkursus in Verpleegkunde.

Volgens het ons ingegaan op die verskeie fasette soos in u opdrag versoek:

Diploma in Verplegingsonderwys

1.1 Waar so 'n kursus struktureel kan inpas:

Aanbeveling 2: 'n Studieraad vir Verpleegkunde met 'n vakkomitee Verpleegkunde in die Fakulteit Lettere en Wysbegeerte word voorgestel en wel om die volgende redes:

- 1.1.1 Die eiesoortigheid van verpleegstersopleiding veroorsaak dat geen bestaande studieraad goed daarby inskakel nie. (Die studieraad wat die naaste hieraan kom is die Studieraad vir die Professionele Opleiding van Sosiaal-Wetenskaplikes aangesien vakke binne hierdie studieraad as 'n tweede hoofvak vir die graadkursus in Verpleegkunde kan dien.) Die dosente-kursus en graadkursus behoort natuurlik in dieselfde studieraad en l.g. kan dus in die nuwe voorgestelde Studieraad vir Verpleegstersopleiding ressorteer.
- 1.1.2 Die administratiewe vereistes wat deur die Verpleegstersraad gestel word, is besonder hoog. Gedetailleerde gewens oor die werklike aantal uur aan die verskillende praktika pandeer (bv. 10 uur in 'n saal vir mans, 15 geboortes van papas geassisteer, 5 babas self gehelp ens.) moet gehou word ten einde die verpleegsterstudent aan die einde van die kursus as 'n verpleegster te registreer. Hierdie tipe rekords kan alleen sinvol gehou word binne 'n vakkomitee met 'n persoon (persone) wat spesifiek daarvoor verantwoordelik is.
- 1.1.3 'n Eie vakkomitee en studieraad sal die struktuur daarstel dat die vak kan ontwikkel soos nodig sonder om gekoppel te wees aan 'n ander rigting vir blote administratiewe reëlins.
- 1.1.4 Die Fakulteit Lettere en Wysbegeerte is die sinvolste tuisfakulteit weens die assosiasie met ander vakke in die Fakulteit bv. Sosiologie, Sielkunde en Maatskaplike Werk wat by die graadkursus as tweede hoofvak dien.

1.2 Akademiese Peil

Aanbeveling 3: Die akademiese peil word op eerstejaarsvlak gestel.

AANBEVELINGS

Die voorgaande volg dit dat die komitee voel dat die aanbieding van 'n Diploma Verplegingsdosente slegs sinvol sal wees indien dit tesame met 'n graadkursus Verpleegkunde gesien word en aanbeveling 1 volg uit hierdie beskouing.

Aanbeveling 1: Dat die instelling van 'n Diploma vir Verplegingsdosente slegs word indien dit onmiddellik of 'n jaar na die eerste aanbieding ingeskakel word by 'n graadkursus in Verpleegkunde.

Volgens het ons ingegaan op die verskeie fasette soos in u opdrag versoek:

Diploma in Verplegingsonderwys

1.1 Waar so 'n kursus struktureel kan inpas:

Aanbeveling 2: 'n Studieraad vir Verpleegkunde met 'n vakkomitee Verpleegkunde in die Fakulteit Lettere en Wysbegeerte word voorgestel en wel om die volgende redes:

- 1.1.1 Die eiesoortigheid van verpleegstersopleiding veroorsaak dat geen bestaande studieraad goed daarby inskakel nie. (Die studieraad wat die naaste hieraan kom is die Studieraad vir die Professionele Opleiding van Sosiaal-Wetenskaplikes aangesien vakke binne hierdie studieraad as 'n tweede hoofvak vir die graadkursus in Verpleegkunde kan dien.) Die dosente-kursus en graadkursus behoort natuurlik in dieselfde studieraad en l.g. kan dus in die nuwe voorgestelde Studieraad vir Verpleegstersopleiding ressorteer.
- 1.1.2 Die administratiewe vereistes wat deur die Verpleegstersraad gestel word, is besonder hoog. Gedetailleerde gewens oor die werklike aantal uur aan die verskillende praktika pandeer (bv. 10 uur in 'n saal vir mans, 15 geboortes van papas geassisteer, 5 babas self gehelp ens.) moet gehou word ten einde die verpleegsterstudent aan die einde van die kursus as 'n verpleegster te registreer. Hierdie tipe rekords kan alleen sinvol gehou word binne 'n vakkomitee met 'n persoon (persone) wat spesifiek daarvoor verantwoordelik is.
- 1.1.3 'n Eie vakkomitee en studieraad sal die struktuur daarstel dat die vak kan ontwikkel soos nodig sonder om gekoppel te wees aan 'n ander rigting vir blote administratiewe reëlins.
- 1.1.4 Die Fakulteit Lettere en Wysbegeerte is die sinvolste tuisfakulteit weens die assosiasie met ander vakke in die Fakulteit bv. Sosiologie, Sielkunde en Maatskaplike Werk wat by die graadkursus as tweede hoofvak dien.
- 1.1.5 In hierdie stadium word 'n Departement Anatomie en Fisiologie nie as gewens beskou nie want verpleegstersopleiding kan meer sinvol binne 'n vakkomitee Verpleegkunde geskied as binne 'n vakkomitee Anatomie en Fisiologie wat in elk geval spesiaal vir die doel geskep moet word.

1.2 Akademie Peil

Aanbeveling 3: Die akademiese peil word op eerstejaarsvlak gestel.

1.3 Die hele curriculum

Aanbeveling 4: Die curriculum kan nie in hierdie stadium in detail voorgestel word nie want dit is 'n aktiwiteit van die Studieraad. As leidraad en vir die berekeninge wat volg, is U.P. as voorbeeld geneem. Sien bylae A.

1.4 Finansiële implikasies

Die finansiële implikasies kan op verskeie maniere bereken word. In elke geval word U.P. se leerplan as voorbeeld geneem met 'n maksimum van 900 periodes en 90 praktika oor 45 weke (20 lesings en 2 praktika/week vir 45 weke).

1.4.1 Indien aanvaar word dat U.P.E. in totaal verantwoordelik is vir die aanbieding van die diploma sal 2280 uur beskikbaar gestel moet word sonder om die navorsingsfaktor in aanmerking te neem. Dit kom op ongeveer 2 DE neer.

1.4.2 Indien die volgende vakke deur K.P.A. m.b.v. medici aangebied word, is slegs 25% hiervan nodig nl. 0,5 DE.

(Anatomie, Fisiologie, Farmakologie, Mikrobiologie, Mediese Fisika, Voedingsleer).

Waarskynlik lê die werklike syfer tussen hierdie twee uiterstes.

Aanbeveling 5: Dat 'n dosent aangestel word in die vakkomitee Verpleegkunde wat verantwoordelik sal wees vir die ontwikkeling, organisasie en aanbieding van die verpleegstersvakke. Hierdie persoon sal in die eerstejaar die Verpleegstersdosente Diploma vestig asook 'n graad in Verpleegkunde beplan wat van die tweedejaar af aangebied sal word.

In hierdie stadium word vir 'n seniorlektoraat begroot (daar is iemand beskikbaar) en in terme van personeel is die aanvanklike koste dus R8 100. Die presiese omvang van die bystand van die Provinsiale Administrasie sal ook bepaal moet word.

Opmerking: Indien Anatomie, Histologie en Fisiologie deur U.P.E. aangebied moet word, sal 'n addisionele 1,5 DE d.w.s. R9 300 teen lektorskaal bereken, bygevoeg moet word.

1.5.3 Prof. C. Searle van U.P., totdat finale beslag aan die studierigting gegee is.

1.5.4 Die Superintendent van die Port Elizabethse Provinsiale Hospitaal of sy verteenwoordiger

1.5.5 Drie ander verteenwoordigers deur die Direkteur Hospitaal Dienste aangewys.

1.6 Fasiliteite

Vir lesings is die gewone klaskamers voldoende.

Vir praktika kan U.P.E. in hierdie stadium wel fasiliteite vir Anatomie, Fisiologie en Histologie aanbied indien daar minder as 10 studente is. Die ander praktika waarvoor U.P.E. verantwoordelik is, behoort geen probleme op te lewer nie.

Vir proefonderwys word die Sharley Cribb Verpleegsterskollege voorgestel.

Vir die verplegingsaspekte kan die plaaslike hospitaal se dienste in samewerking met die betrokke owerhede gebruik word.

1.7 Aanverwante aangeleenthede

By die aanstelling van dosente moet daar gewaak word teen die stigting van 'n kollege binne die Universiteit. Sover as wat prakties moontlik is, moet bestaande vakkomitees verantwoordelik gemaak word vir die aanbieding van lesings. Dikwels sal dit nodig wees om spesiale kursusse in te stel en die kursusse behoort by sy normale vakkomitee ingeskakel te word. In hierdie verband behoort ook ingedagte gehou te word dat indien 'n vakkomitee reeds onderbeman is, die aanbieding van 'n dienskursus, sonder dat personeel toegevoeg word, weerstand by so 'n vakkomitee teen die instelling van die Diploma kan laat ontstaan.

2.2 Akademiese peil

Die B-graad strek oor 4½ jaar indien Pretoria as voorbeeld geneem word.

2.3 Curriculum

Dit is 'n funksie van die Studieraad maar vir verdere berekeninge is U.P. se curriculum vir hul kursus Baccalaureus Curationis (B.Cur.) as leidraad geneem. Sien bylae B.

2.4 Finansiële implikasies

2.4.1 Eerste jaar

'n Gewone lading van 5 lesings/week per kursus is vir berekening geneem.

Die volgende vakke moet addisioneel deur U.P.E. aangebied word:

Verpleegkunde I 5 lesings/week + praktika

Die ander vakke: Chemie I, Anatomie en Histologie, Sosiologie I of Sielkunde I en Biofisika word reeds aangebied of word vir die Diploma onder 1 benodig.

Die komitee voel dat dieselfde dosent wat die Verpleegkunde komponent by die Diploma vir dosente hanteer, ook hierdie kursus kan behartig want die DE sonder navorsing is 0,3 DE.

2.4.2 Tweedejaar

'n Vol kursus word as 5 lesings per week aanvaar in ooreenstemming met algemene gebruik by U.P.E.

Die volgende vakke moet addisioneel aangebied word deur U.P.E.:

Verpleegkunde II 5 lesings/week + prakties.

Die ander vakke nl. Fisiologie en Biochemie, Sosiologie II of Sielkunde II, Sosiologie I of Sielkunde I (of Maatskaplike Werk I) word reeds aangebied.

In terme van DE sonder navorsing is die lading ongeveer 0,4 DE.

Dit is heelwaarskynlik dat plaaslike geneeshere ook met hierdie kursus kan help maar tot welke mate is in hierdie stadium onseker.

2.4.3 Derdejaar

Weer eens is 5 lesings per week as basis geneem.

Verpleegkunde III (5 lesings/week + praktika).

Die volgende vak is 'n reedsbestaande vak by U.P.E.:

2.4.4 Vierdejaar (3e jaar peil)

Psigiatriese Verpleegkunde (5 lesings/week + prakties)

Die volgende vakke sal m.b.v. plaaslike medici aangebied kan word:

In terme van DE is U.P.E. se verantwoordelikheid ongeveer 1,2 DE.

2.4.5 Vyfdejaar (3e jaar peil)

Psigiatriese Verpleegkunde II (5 lesings/week + prakties)

Ongeveer 0,5 DE word hiervoor benodig.

Opmerking: In al hierdie berekeninge vir Verpleegkunde I - IV is praktika nie bygebring nie want die aard van hospitaalpraktika is nie vergelykbaar met laboratoriumpraktika nie. Die navorsingsfaktor is ook buite berekening gelaat.

By U.P.E. sal ruimte en fasiliteite onder die huidige omstandighede 'n groot probleem wees vir meer as 10 studente in die vakke Anatomie en Fisiologie. Indien voorstelle wat tans onder oorweging is, aanvaar word, verval die probleem.

2.7 Aanverwante aangeleenthede

Dit is in hierdie stadium onmoontlik om die aantal studente vir die graadkursus te skat want dit hang tot 'n groot mate af van die beurse wat die K.P.A. beskikbaar gaan stel.

D. ALGEMENE GEVOLGTREKKING

Die stigting van 'n Vakkomitee Verpleegkunde in die Fakulteit Lettere en Wysbegeerte word hiermee aanbeveel vir die aanbieding van die 4½-jarige graadkursus en die Diploma vir Verpleegstersdosente.

Die opleiding sal gesamentlik deur U.P.E. en K.P.A. onderneem word en in hierdie stadium word U.P.E. se finansiële verpligting op 1 DE vir die Diploma, 1,9 DE vir die graadkursus as 'n minimum gestel met 'n hoë waarskynlikheid dat 1,5 DE ook nog bykomend mag wees afhangende van die mate waartoe die K.P.A. hulself kompromiteer. In totaal lê ons verantwoordelikheid dus tussen 2,9 en 4,4 DE. Hierdie aspek sal later met die K.P.A. gepresiseer moet word.
