These are definitely diplomas. Distance Education originally incorrectly gave qualifications 17551 and 17552 the titles BCur (I et A) - Diploma in ...., but Val has since corrected this on ITS (/SACAD) to reflect the true titles and qualification. Both these qualification codes are for the Distance Education students. Our on-campus programmes are 18400 and 18600 (we have currently no students registered for the on-campus programmes). We have 1 student that was incorrectly registered for 17552 by the International Office, but they are supposed to be correcting this and changing the qualification to Occasional.

As for the projections, there was confusion between the Department of Nursing and Distance Education whether we needed permission from the DOE to offer these diplomas via Distance which was a change in the mode of delivery. Subsequently, permission was never sought from the DOE and we do not have permission to offer them via distance at present. We have students in these diploma programmes and they will have to be allowed to finish, probably without subsidy.
