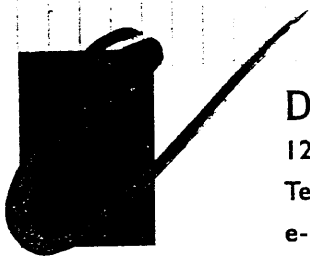

ACADEMIC PROGRAMME MATTERS SUBMITTED FOR THE INFORMATION OF THE MINISTER

In accordance with the Department of Education's prescriptions in the latest document "University requests regarding new learning programmes" (February 1999), the Council of UPE (meeting of 15 September 2000) hereby wishes to inform the Minister of the following:

1. DISCONTINUATION OF LEARNING PROGRAMMES WITH EFFECT FROM 2001

1.1 FACULTY OF EDUCATION

Further Diploma in Education: Gifted Education
Further Diploma in Education: Early Childhood Development (Pre-School)
Further Diploma in Education: Economic Sciences

Motivation

These qualifications have not been offered for the past six years (one of them was never offered) and are not being submitted to SAQA for registration:

1.2 FACULTY OF HEALTH SCIENCES

Diploma in Nursing Education and Community Nursing Science

Diploma in Nursing Administration and Community Nursing Science be approved.

These fields also exist as separate single-field diplomas and it is recommended that the above double diplomas be phased out. This will enable students to obtain a qualification sooner.

STREET CAMPUS

RULES FOR THE DIPLOMA IN NURSING ADMINISTRATION

Prerequisite for offering programme: A minimum of 8 candidates per intake

The Faculty Rules for this diploma as contained in the 1996 Calendar, shall apply with the following exception:

1. DURATION OF STUDY

1.1 The curriculum shall extend over a period of at least three academic years of part-time study.

3. ADMISSION

In addition to the Faculty Rules as contained in the Calendar, the following conditions are also applicable to a part-time student wishing to enrol for the above-mentioned diploma:

3.1 Applicants for admission will be selected.

3.2 Candidates must hold a full-time or part-time nursing post at an approved registered hospital or institution.

3.3 A written undertaking from the candidate's employer that a candidate will be granted time off in order to attend lectures and to write examinations must be submitted when registering for the first time.

3.4 The prescribed courses for each year of study will not be offered in the following year. A candidate who fails a course in any year of study will therefore have to apply for permission to repeat the course at the Summerstrand Campus together with the full-time students. Such permission will be subject to compliance with the regulations regarding the admission of students at that time.

Geagte prof. Erasmus,

Hiermee die twee voorstelle in verband met :

1. Die Diploma in Verplegingsadministrasie (eenjarige kursus) en
2. Die Diploma in Verplegingsadministrasie en Gemeenskaps-gesondheidverpleegkunde (een-en-n-half-jarige kursus).

Ek beveel 2. aan vir die volgende redes :

- 2.1. Die tyd het aangebreek dat die administratiewe verpleegpersoneel 'n breër insig kry in die lewering van gesondheidsdienste in die gemeenskap sodat hulle meer doeltreffend in die administratiewe situasie kan optree.
- 2.2. So 'n integrering van die konsepte lei tot 'n besparing van 6 maande in die tyd van die geregistreerde verpleegster, en lei tot 'n besparing van + R2 000 vir haar werkgever. Tans doen sy twee 1-jarige diploma-kursusse om hierdie doel te bereik. Dit is onnodige verkwisting van die land se geld en mannekrag.
- 2.3. Die Hoofverplegingsbeampte van die Kaapprovinsie ondersteun die konsep heelhartiglik.
- 2.4. Die saak is in breë trekke met lede van die S.A. Verpleegstersraad bespreek. Amptelik kan daar eers 'n besluit oor wees as 'n stuk voor die Uitvoerende Komitee dien. Dit blyk dat die beginsel van integrering van kursusse tot een doeltreffende eenheid sterk byval vind en ek dink daar sal geen probleme wees met erkenning van die kursus nie. Ek beveel derhalwe (2) hierbo aan.

2.5. Die kostefaktore bly dieselfde want die voorstelle is gemik op die gebruik van die graadkursusse en die registrasie vir die laaste halfjaar sal die getalle opstoot.

3. Graag wil ek u daarop attent maak dat die leergange en die toepaslike regulasies, plus die inhoud van die leerplanne, aan die S.A. Verpleegstersraad voorgelê moet word, voordat studente ingeskryf word.

Die regulasies i.v.m. bevordering van een jaar tot die ander sal ook opgestel moet word volgens die sisteem wat by u Universiteit in werking is.

Is dit nie miskien wenslik dat ek nou die voorleggings vir die S.A. Verpleegstersraad voorberei en aan u stuur vir die fynere afwerking in verband met regulasies en vir voorlegging aan u Senaat nie? Daarna sal dit miskien wenslik wees as 'n afvaardiging van U.P.E. 'n onderhoud met die Uitvoerende Komitee van die S.A. Verpleegstersraad voer. Ek is lid van die Komitee en sal daar wees om die saak aan te help. Die Komitee vergader 1^o Oktober 1974. Ek sal in Port Elizabeth op Vrydag 7 September 1974 wees. Miskien sal ons dan in staat wees om alles finaal af te rond vir die S.A. Verpleegstersraad sodat u dan net die voorlegging kan maak.

Die opleiding moet teen Oktober adverteer word anders sal daar nie kandidate wees nie. Die poste moet ook adverteer word. Met die ontwikkelings aan ander universiteite sal daar probleme wees met geskikte personeel as daar nie vroegtydig opgetree word nie.

4. Onthou tog net dat ek nie die Presidente van die S.A. Verpleegstersraad is nie, alhoewel ek 'n lid is. Ek is die Presidente van die S.A. Verpleegstersvereniging wie se taak dit is om die ontwikkeling van die verpleegonderwys te bevorder. Die Raad is die waghond van die publiek en kour net goed vir registrasiedoeleindes en doen inspeksies van die onderwysprogramme. Ek wil nie op die ander Presidente se tone trap nie.

5. Sal u my so gou moontlik laat weet of ek voorlê die verdere besonderhede moet opstel. Ek stel alles net in kernkonsepte op wat die basiese vereistes is, sodat elke professor die kursusse kan aanbied volgens die menswyse.

Ek is bevrees dat ons nie kan wag totdat die professor diens aanvaar nie want die saak moet teen Oktober by die S.A. Verpleegstersraad dien.

Ek werk solank aan die stukke terwyl ek 'n kans het.


Die Kapenaars sê u is een van die dae daar vir verdere samesprekings. Hulle is vuur en vlam.

1. Admission Requirements

- (i) The Matriculation or Matriculation Exemption Certificate or an approved School Leaving Certificate;

- (ii) The candidate must present proof that he/she is registered with the South African Nursing Council as a general nurse and as a midwife in the case of a female candidate, and as a registered general nurse in the case of male candidates. Registration must be maintained throughout the course.

2. Duration of Course

The course extends over a period of at least one-and-a-half long academic years (72 weeks). Registered general nurses who are also registered as midwives and as tutors or as public health nurses, or equivalent with the South African Nursing Council may complete the course in one long academic year and will be exempted from certain subjects according to the qualification/s they hold.

These are definitely diplomas. Distance Education originally incorrectly gave qualifications 17551 and 17552 the titles BCur (I et A) - Diploma in, but Val has since corrected this on ITS (/SACAD) to reflect the true titles and qualification. Both these qualification codes are for the Distance Education students. Our on-campus programmes are 18400 and 18600 (we have currently no students registered for the on-campus programmes). We have 1 student that was incorrectly registered for 17552 by the International Office, but they are supposed to be correcting this and changing the qualification to Occasional.

As for the projections, there was confusion between the Department of Nursing and Distance Education whether we needed permission from the DOE to offer these diplomas via Distance which was a change in the mode of delivery. Subsequently, permission was never sought from the DOE and we do not have permission to offer them via distance at present. We have students in these diploma programmes and they will have to be allowed to finish, probably without subsidy.
