APPROVAL TO OFFER THE DIPLOMA IN COMMUNITY NURSING SCIENCE IN EAST LONDON

1. Our letter of 1 December 1993 (annexure 1) refers. Paragraph 2 states that UPE will forward the formal resolution of Rhodes University Council regarding concurrent academic activity of UPE in East London. We have now received this.
2. The Rhodes University Senate and Council have approved our request conditionally as follows:
 - 2.1 "Courses in Psychology and Sociology should be taught by Rhodes University, East London. You are advised to liaise with the Director of Rhodes University, East London in this regard."
 - 2.2 "The Diploma in Community Nursing Science may be offered for a five-year period in the first instance, with the continuation beyond that period to be reviewed by Rhodes University nearer to the time."

A copy of the relevant correspondence is attached as well as our reply thereto (annexures 2, 3 and 4).

3. UPE accepts the conditions and is at present liaising with the Director of the Rhodes University's East London Division regarding the presentation of the courses in question by Rhodes staff according to the UPE syllabi.

UPE will inform you as soon as possible of the outcome, with full details (e.g. financial arrangements, accreditation and lecturers etc.). Early indications are, however, that the Rhodes Department of Sociology in East London is unable to assist with the course in Basic Sociology.

- 1 The University currently offers the BCur (I et A) degree and the Diploma in Nursing Administration at its Port Elizabeth campus. This application (approved at a meeting of the University Senate on 17 September 1997 and will be approved by Council on 10 October 1997), is for permission to offer the B Cur (I et A) and Diploma in Nursing Administration also in the George magisterial district with effect from 1998.
- 2 The University received your permission to offer the Diploma in Community Nursing Science in George as from 1991 and has done so successfully since then. There is now an established demand to also offer both the BCur (I et A) and the Diploma in Nursing Administration as well in George. The motivation and other details are attached - see annexure.
- 3 The Minister's approval for the offering of the above Degree and Diploma in George with effect from 01.01.1998 is hereby applied for in terms of Section 3 of the University of Port Elizabeth Act (Act No 1 of 1964) as amended. The University is not aware of any other residential University which offers degrees or diplomas in George. Section 3 of the University of Port Elizabeth Act provides:

"Seat of the University

The seat of the University shall be at Port Elizabeth in the province of the Eastern Cape; Provided that the University may, with the approval of the Minister, also conduct its academic activities outside its seat: Provided further that, if a subject is taught within the seat of another university or at a place where the academic activities of another university are carried on under the Act of that university or with the approval of the Minister, such subject shall be taught with the approval of that other university and the Minister".

DIPLOMA IN COMMUNITY NURSING SCIENCE: EAST LONDON

1. Extension of period for UPE to offer diploma

At Rhodes' request, the Minister granted approval for UPE to offer the above diploma in East London for an initial five-year period, i.e. from 1994 to 1998.

The first intake of students was in 1994. Thirty eight (38) students registered and Rhodes offered the Basic Psychology course. The second intake of students was in 1996. Eighteen (18) students registered and Rhodes offered the Basic Sociology course. A third intake of students is envisaged for 1998 as the course has now successfully run over a four-year period. As the diploma is offered part-time over two years of study, the second year would run into 1999 which is beyond the five-year approved period. We therefore request an extension to the original five-year period. (A copy of the original ministerial letter of approval is attached).

2. Offering of courses

We need to know if Rhodes wishes to offer Basic Sociology *and/or Psychology* in 1998. UPE offered the Basic Psychology course in 1996 and can do so for the new intake of *mnd* students in 1998.

We are grateful to you for your valued support received in the past and look forward to continued co-operation between our two institutions.

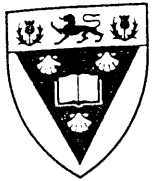
