

# VC Virtual Welcoming Ceremony Address Pre-recorded (on 25 January) for 29 January 2022 YouTube Premiere Launch at 9am

#### Welcome

Molweni, Goeie Môre, Good morning, Sanibonani, Dumelang

It is my great honour and privilege to welcome you all to Nelson Mandela University, at what is officially the start of the 2022 academic year.

We, as the Nelson Mandela University family, greet you all – parents, guardians, friends and other family members, and especially, our new students - with warmth, enthusiasm and a deep sense of commitment at the start of this academic year. Thank you for choosing Nelson Mandela University as your path to an exciting future.

The last two years have been a very difficult moment nationally and globally. The world as we knew it was thrust into turmoil by the coronavirus pandemic. # **Our Support in Times of COVID-19**

As Mandela University, we consistently strive to improve our facilities, processes and services. In these past two years, we have adapted to new ways of working, studying and living; and believe we are better placed to support you than ever before.

## **COVID-19 compliance measures**

Much as we are striving to move towards normalising our situation, we need to be aware that the pandemic is still with us. From time to time you will receive updates and new information on COVID-19 regulations. I urge you all to take these seriously.

## Safety and vaccination

Your health and safety is our priority, which is why Nelson Mandela University is strongly advocating that *all* its staff and students be vaccinated. Vaccination remains our strongest defence against the severe effects of COVID-19.

We were the first university in South Africa to become an accredited public vaccination centre. We have dispensed more than 17 000 vaccinations to date to staff, students and members of the public. More than 70 percent of our staff are already fully vaccinated.

We are offering vaccinations at registration points, and at the clinics on each of our campuses. All our students are being asked to share their vaccination details so that we can monitor our numbers, because the greater our vaccination numbers, the sooner we can return to normal campus life again. And so I urge you to please make use of the opportunity as soon as possible, if you are not already vaccinated.

## Virtual support

Last year we provided an additional 1 939 laptops, 30Gig data bundles every month, and improved the quality of WiFi for students living both on campus and in accredited off-campus residences, to enable our students to complete their academic year.

Similar efforts will be ongoing this year. Mandela University's unequivocal commitment to ensure that none of our students is digitally excluded, will be given impetus through our student laptop initiative. Students are encouraged to look out for more information on this initiative.

Our shift to online platforms comes with new challenges. At Mandela University, we believe that cyber discernment is everyone's responsibility. To this end, I urge all students to take a moment and familiarise themselves with our cybersecurity guidelines.

#### Orientation

Please do not feel daunted if this all sounds a little overwhelming! We are here to help, which is why from next week you will have the opportunity to participate in the orientation, or what is also known as the First Year Success programme. These interactions are aimed at helping you transition to university life. They will include sessions on how to use online tools like Moodle, Zoom and Microsoft Teams. You will receive information as to which programmes will be on line, and which will be mask-to-mask, and which ones will be a combination of this.

## **Psycho-Social Support and Coaching**

Our University offers a range of psycho-social support – from how to manage your time, through to counselling. The impact of the pandemic has led to world-wide concerns with mental wellbeing.

If you experience challenges in this regard, please do not suffer in silence. We can, and we want to, help anyone who feels overwhelmed, anxious or distressed in any way.

#### Conclusion

As you embark on what is arguably the most exciting journey of your life to date, I would like to emphasise that you have been afforded a rare opportunity to obtain a tertiary qualification – an opportunity that you should embrace and enjoy.

Take advantage of all Mandela University has to offer. Get fully involved in both curricular and extra-curricular activities. And work hard. There is no substitute for that.
