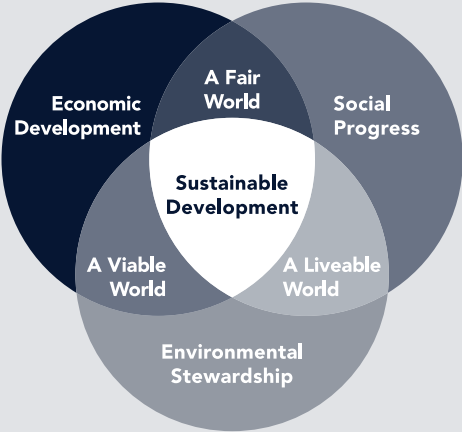

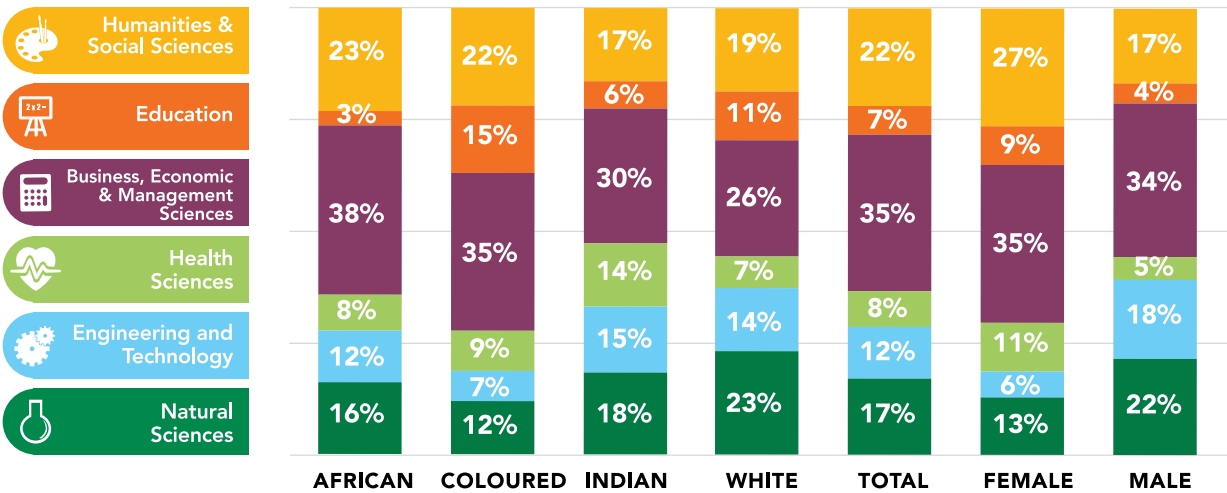
SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT DEFINED

ENROLMENTS BY MAJOR FIELD OF STUDY 2016

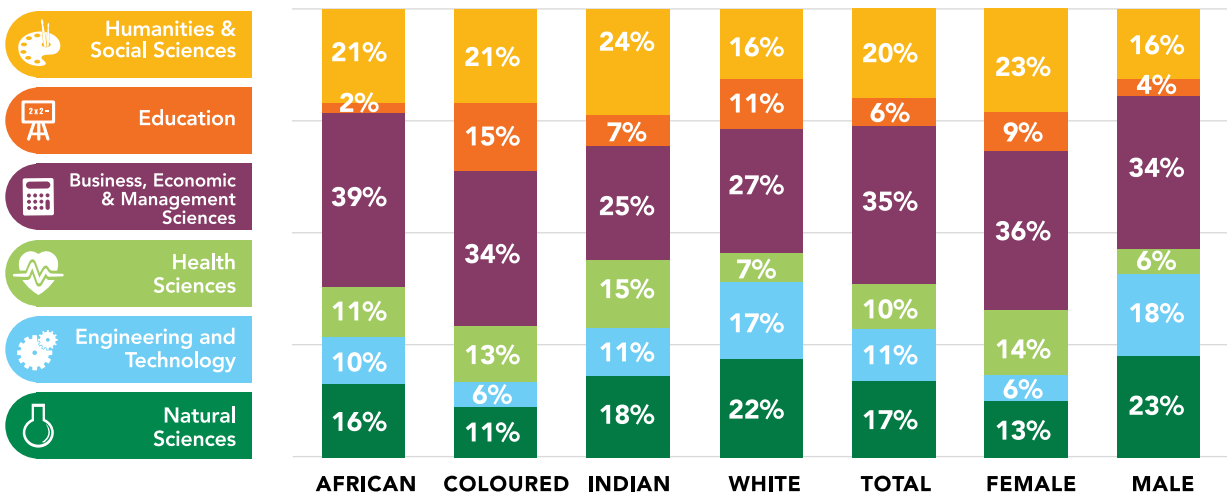


The distribution of population groups* and gender across major fields of study, 2016.

THE MAJOR FIELDS OF STUDY ARE CATEGORISED AS FOLLOWS:

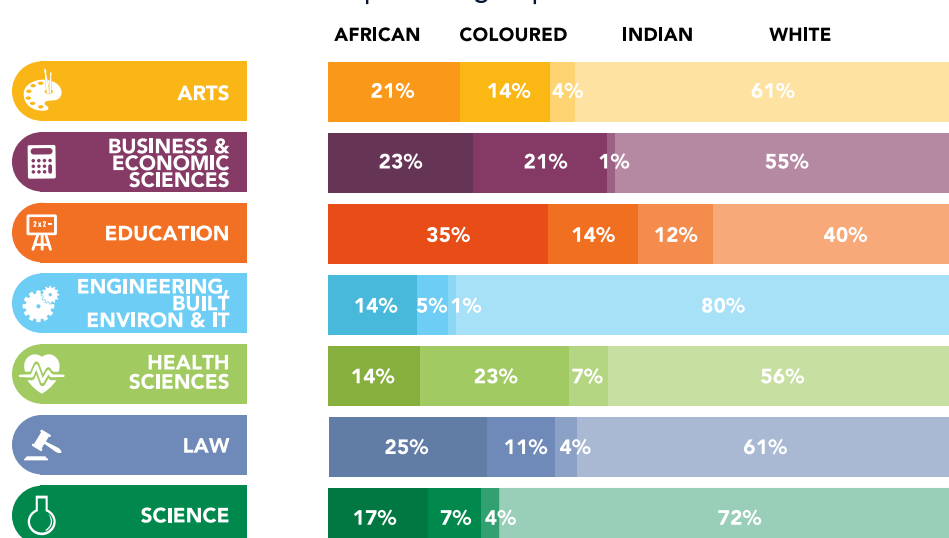
- HUMANITIES AND SOCIAL SCIENCES**
Being fine arts, music and drama, communication and journalism studies, languages and literature, law, public management and services, psychology, sociology and anthropology, history, political sciences, military sciences, philosophy and religious studies.
- EDUCATION**
Made up of studies in pre-primary, primary, secondary and post-school education, and the training of teachers at all levels.
- BUSINESS, ECONOMICS AND MANAGEMENT**
Including accounting, auditing, economics, finance, business administration, and various management programmes.

- HEALTH SCIENCES**
Being health professions and related clinical sciences.
- ENGINEERING AND TECHNOLOGY**
Made up of engineering and architecture and the built environment.
- NATURAL SCIENCES**
Including agriculture and agriculture operations, computer and information sciences, family ecology and consumer sciences, life sciences and physical sciences, mathematics and statistics.

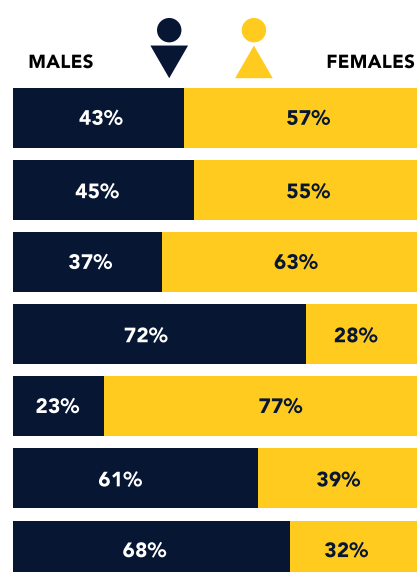

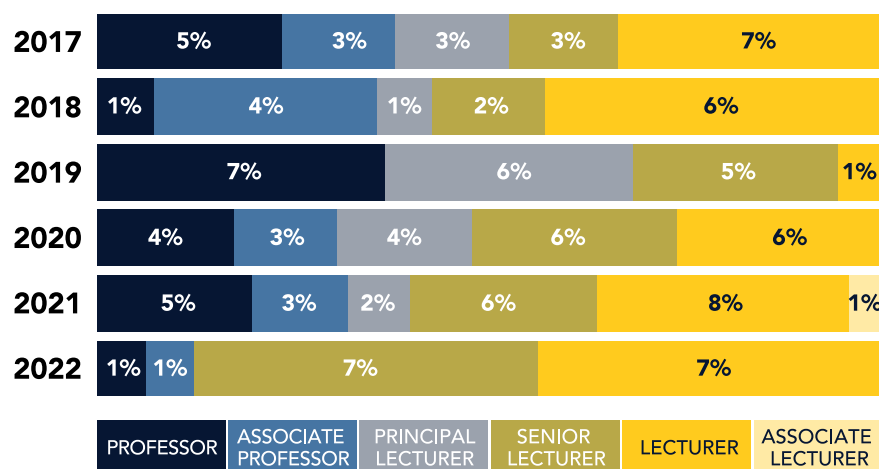
Population groups across faculties: ACADEMIC

Academic retirements by rank from 2017 to 2022



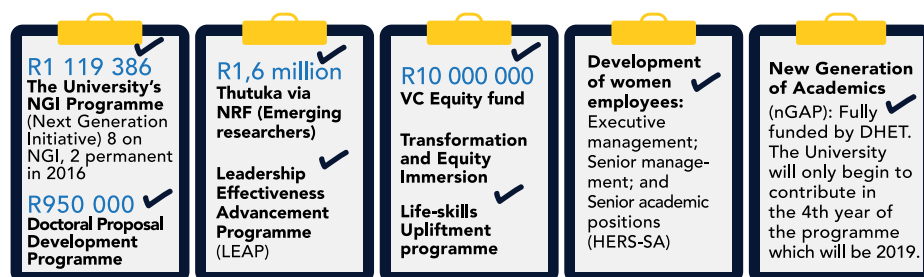

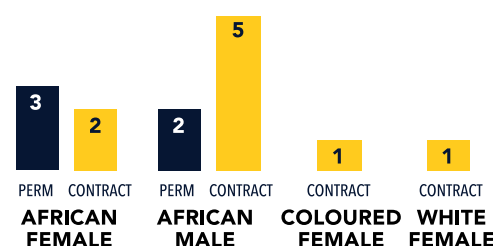
NOTE: Of the 118 Academic Staff, 48% will retire at age 60 and 51% at age 65. One staff member will retire at age 63.

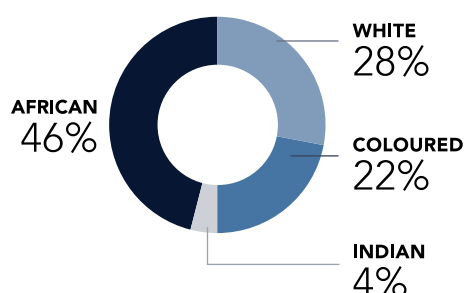


New generation academic programme as at 31 August 2017



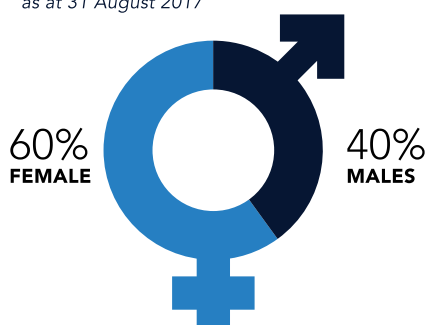
Profile of PASS* staff population groups

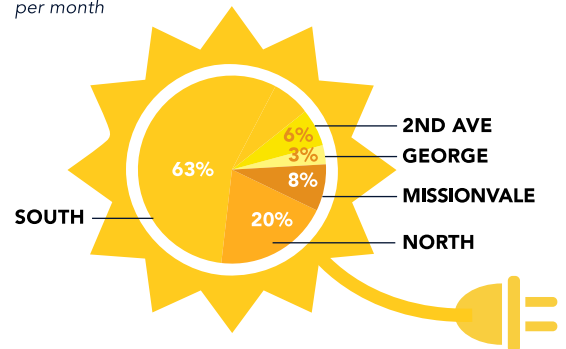

Overall % electricity consumption per campus per month



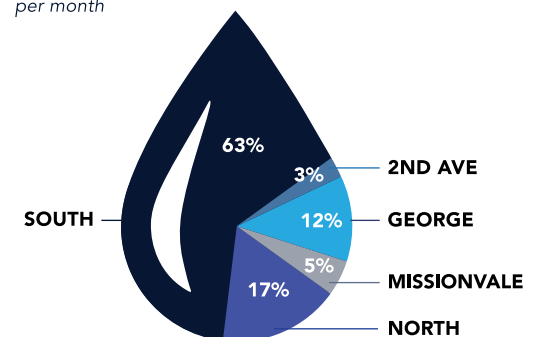

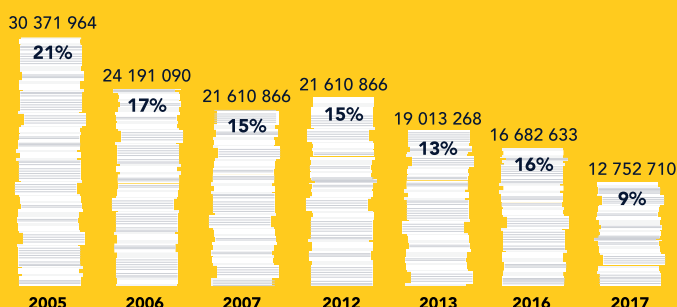
